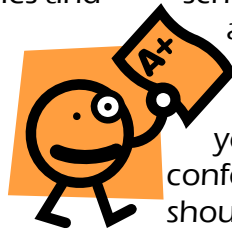
PARENT TEACHER CONFERENCES

so many supporting parents came to watch. They started off the game 3-11 Brandon in the first quarter. Although they played a great game unfortunately they could not

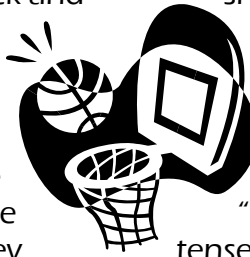
catch up. The final score was 13-22, Brandon. After the game I interviewed Heidi Wagner, she said "We played well, but we could use some improvement.
