WONEWOC-CENTER SCHOOL MASCOT CHANGES

The Wonewoc-Union Center School District has taken a proactive stance on the mascot issue that has been going through the state legislature this past year. The process for making the change in our mascot has gone by smoothly. We started our process with the community, staff, and students being able to make suggestions for a new mascot. These suggestions were narrowed down to the top twenty-five choices. These choices were then voted on by the students, staff, and community members and were narrowed down to the top six choices. The top six choices were Green Raiders, Pride, Wild Cats, Wild Coyotes, Wolverines, and Wolves. These top six choices were put to a final vote that went out to our communities and to the staff and students in our school building. These votes were tabulated, and the **Wolves** won. This final vote was taken to the June 15th school board meeting and was approved by the school board.

This is not the end of our mascot change. We also need to choose an actual mascot logo. The art department has been asked to work with the students to create a logo. There will be more information on this process as it is being done. We will be retiring the Indian mascot at the beginning of the 2009-2010 school year. More information will follow on that also. 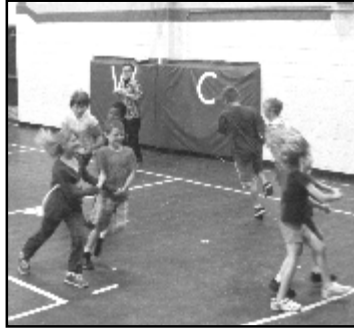

W-C RALLIES FOR CYSTIC FIBROSIS BY "TRUCKIN' FOR TUCKER"

Words cannot express the gratitude and PRIDE that was felt during the months of April and May as Wonewoc-Center students, staff, and community members participated in the "Truckin' For Tucker" efforts to raise awareness and funds for Cystic Fibrosis!

It all started with the 8th Grade Leadership Team's desire to carry on the efforts of the previous Leadership Team to work with the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation this year, as one of their school/community projects. This year's Leadership Team comprised of **Emma J, Josh B, Bree M, Gabe B, and Nick A** had no idea how Wonewoc-Center would once again rally for this cause!

A "Truckin' For Tucker" Movie Night was held for all students in Kindergarten through 8th grade on April 17th in the Old Gym. With a \$5 donation given to participate in the festivities, over 80 students enjoyed a fun night! The Leadership Team was able to raise \$432 for Cystic Fibrosis research. **OUTSTANDING!** A very special "Thank You" to all those parents that either joined their child/children in attending or allowed them to participate. The popcorn was delicious, the lemonade refreshing, and the movies were delightful!

Special "Dress-up" days were held during the week of April 27-30th with students donating \$1 each day to participate. Monday brought in all kinds of hats, Tuesday was a pretty comfortable day with everyone going to class in their pajamas, Wednesday we saw some pretty cool dudes and dudettes in their "shades" for the day, and Thursday was "Tropical Day!" From grass skirts to Hawaiian shirts, everyone seemed to be having fun! On Friday, everyone was encouraged to wear their "Truckin' for Tucker" t-shirts.

A special assembly was held for Tucker N on Friday, May 1st. Tucker is a first grade student at our school and was diagnosed with Cystic Fibrosis when he was 6 months old, and his father is a high school Phy. Ed. Teacher, at our school. The whole school was introduced to our "king" for the day -- Tucker! Seated on his special "throne" the students quickly became aware of what life is like for Tucker, through a letter written by his mother, Mrs. Needham, and a video montage created by her, also. Many student groups shared cheers, songs, and chants to only have the whole student body join in with homemade signs of support! Dani N, a 5th grade student shared a speech she had written for the Modern Woodman Speech Contest centered around the theme, "a person who has touched many lives." She chose to write about Tucker. The Needham family was recognized by a Cystic Fibrosis Foundation representative, as the #1 family in Wisconsin, for their fund raising efforts to find a cure for this disease. **CONGRATULATIONS!**

Following the assembly program, the entire student body took part in their own "Truckin' for Tucker" Cystic Fibrosis Walk that took them to downtown Wonewoc and back. The weather was great, as older students paired up with younger students, to help raise awareness for Cystic Fibrosis. After the walk, students and community members were treated to water and healthy snacks, all provided through donations from **Wal*Mart, Home Depot, Kwik Trip, Carr Valley Cheese, and Wonewoc-Center Schools**. Special "thanks" to Ms. O'Leary for collecting many of our donations!

Students had time to relax or dance to some pump-up songs provided by Miss Louis. And then it was off to the new gym for some "Glow-in-the-Dark" basketball! Tucker and his

fellow team members were off and running in the DARK and having a blast! The National Honor Society, who teamed up with the 8th Grade Leadership Team, provided every student with a "glow-in-the-dark" bracelet, so the gym was a "glow" of color! Different classes were teamed up against each other and everyone truly enjoyed the ending of a great afternoon! **A total of \$2,390.51 was collected from pledges for Cystic Fibrosis Research...absolutely outstanding!**

The 8th Grade Leadership Team also set up a stand at the Old Fashioned Day Celebration in downtown Wonewoc on May 16th. They sold baked goods (which they made), and lemonade. They raised **\$100 MORE** to add to our total for our "Truckin' For Tucker" Team!! This very dedicated group of young people were wonderful about donating their time, for this very worthwhile cause...especially on such a windy & cold day!

The BIGGEST event of all was joining the Needham family in Madison for the Great Strides Walk for Cystic Fibrosis. Over 80 students, staff, and family members joined in raising awareness for Cystic Fibrosis on a beautiful day at Monona Terrace. Some rode a bus, with Mr. Fry as our volunteer driver (Thanks Mr. Fry!), while others carpooled in order to spend some family time together. It was quite a sight to see all those "Truckin' For Tucker" t-shirts gathered together for a common cause! Together with all the other walkers present, and some members of the UW-Band, the walk was off! When it was all done the announcement came that \$185,977 was raised that day for Cystic Fibrosis! **And Wonewoc-Center can be very PROUD in knowing that we contributed \$3,642.56 from our "Truckin' For Tucker" events!** WOW! What an exhilarating day!

Regardless of that final number, what really matters is that we joined together to "Make a Difference" in the lives of others. Many lessons can be taught in the classroom, but many times the best lessons in life are **OUTSIDE** of the classroom. THANKS to EVERYONE that joined in this effort in some shape or form. LEARNING ACTIVITIES FOR WAITING TIME OR TRAVELING

1. Choose several travel folders (obtained from state welcome centers, motels and service stations) or objects from the glove compartment or litter bag. Allow children several seconds to study them. Then, while they cover their eyes, remove one of the objects. Let children guess which one was removed. Variation: Display several folders or objects in a row, allow players several seconds to study them, then mix them up, and let children put the objects back in their original order.
2. Designate one person to be "it." "It" begins play by saying, "Ritha, Ritha, Marie, I see something you don't see." The other persons try to guess. Then one who guesses first gets to be "it." Variations: Provide clues. For example, "Ritha, Ritha, Marie, I see something you don't see and it rhymes with _____," or "its color is _____," or "it starts like _____."
3. Choose a color. All players look for something of that color. The first person to point out five things chooses the next color.
4. Using travel folders, newspaper, or other printed material, cut or tear pages apart. Put them back together using cues such as color, letter size, or shapes.
5. Choose several travel folders, line them up and take turns finding certain things. For example, "I see a wooden table. Can you find it?"
6. Have someone choose a word and whisper it from person to person. The last person says aloud what he or she heard. (The final word is often quite different from the original word.)
7. Let one player choose a word. The next player must choose a word that rhymes with it. Play continues until no more rhyming words can be given.
8. Listen to songs on the radio and list or name all the rhyming words.
9. Using travel folders, put in one stack all those folders that are primarily yellow, those that are primarily red, and so on.
10. Using main heading in travel folders, assign each child a "trouble" letter and have them find all the words that begin with their letter or contain their letter.
